Interrupted Fern	<i>Osmunda claytoniana</i>	3-4			W/M	P/S	Easily grown, use in borders and along streams.
Jack in the Pulpit	<i>Arisaema triphyllum</i>	1-2	Apr-June	purple	W/M	P/S	Interesting shade plant, bright red fall fruit, easily grown from seed
Lady Fern	<i>Athyrium filix-femina</i>	1-3			M	P/S	Attractive in shade beds
Maidenhair Fern	<i>Adiantum pedatum</i>	1-2			W/M	P/S	Clump-forming, ornamental fern, good for borders
Ostrich Plume Fern (Royal Fern)	<i>Osmunda regalis</i>	2-4			W/M	P/S	clump-forming, yellow in autumn, needs wet areas
Wild Geranium	<i>Geranium maculatum</i>	1-2	Apr-May	pink	M	F/P/S	Clump-forming, great addition to shade beds
Wild Ginger	<i>Asarum canadensis</i>	0.5-1	Apr-May	red	W/M	P/S	Medicinal uses, satiny deep green heart shaped leaves, groundcover
White Trillium	<i>Trillium grandiflorum</i>	1-2	May-Jun	white	M/D	P/S	long lived, medicinal uses, white flower turns pink with age
